The Presentation of the NYAAPOR 2005 Outstanding Achievement Award to Dr. Murray Edelman

We are proud to honor Murray Edelman with the prestigious NYAAPOR Outstanding Achievement Award on June 20th. Not only is Murray a leading survey research professional but he has also been a dedicated and active member of NYAAPOR and AAPOR.

In his talk, he will be extending the ideas of his well-received AAPOR Presidential Speech about the role of public opinion research in shaping our personal experience of reality. He will draw on examples from the political, sexual, and spiritual areas. This award coincides with a significant career transition in Murray's life and he will be discussing the direction of his research interests in carrying forth these ideas.

MURRAY EDELMAN is currently the Director of Statistics of the Election and Survey Unit at CBS News. Previously for 10 years he was the Editorial Director of Voter News Service, a consortium of ABC, CBS, CNN, FOX, NBC, and the Associated Press where his responsibilities included conducting exit polls of 100,000 voters and estimating the outcome of 500 separate elections, all on one election day. And before that he also worked for CBS News, developing new methods of vote projections and pioneering the use of exit polls for vote analysis.

He has been the President of National AAPOR as well the Chair of the Conference and Publication Committees. He has also been the President of the New York chapter of AAPOR as well as their Counselor-at-Large. He is currently a trustee of the National Council of Public Polls and on the Board of trustees of the Roper Center for Public Opinion Research.

He has presented many conference papers and has written chapters in books, but he is proudest of his AAPOR presidential address in Public Opinion Quarterly (Fall, 2001).

Edelman began his career as a mathematical statistician at the Bureau of the Census. He has also been an Adjunct Associate Professor at Columbia University. He received a BS from the University of Illinois and, in 1973, a Ph.D. in Human Development from the University of Chicago.
